1	Singapore  Siem Reap Assemble at airport and depart to Siem Reap. Upon arrival, check in to hotel.	
2	Siem Reap - Angkor Thom - Ta Prohm - Angkor Wat - Phnom Bakheng After breakfast, visit Angkor Thom , the last and most enduring capital city of the Khmer empire. It was established in the late twelfth century by king Jayavarman VII. It covers an area of 9 km ² , within which are several monuments from earlier eras as well as those established by Jayavarman and his successors. Also visit Ta Prohm , a temple built in the Bayon style largely in the late 12th and early 13th centuries . It was founded by the Khmer King Jayavarman VII as a Mahayana Buddhist monastery and university. Unlike most Angkorian temples, Ta Prohm has been left in much the same condition in which it was found. The photogenic and atmospheric combination of trees growing out of the ruins and the jungle surroundings have made it one of Angkor's most popular temples with visitors. In the afternoon you will tour Angkor Wat , a temple complex at Angkor built for the king Suryavarman II in the early 12th century as his state temple and capital city. As the best-preserved temple at the site, it is the only one to have remained a significant religious centre since its foundation; first Hindu, dedicated to the god Vishnu, then Buddhist. In the evening, be mesmerized by the sunset at Phnom Bakheng .	Breakfast Lunch Dinner
3	Siem Reap - Tonle Sap Lake - Artisans D'Angkor - Angkor Silk Farm - West Baray - Apsara Dance After breakfast, set sail on a cruise on Tonle Sap Lake . It is the largest freshwater lake in South East Asia and is an ecological hot spot that was designated as a UNESCO biosphere in 1997. Next, visit Artisans D'Angkor to discover the traditional Khmer techniques used for stone and wood carving, lacquering and gilding. A complete tour of the workshops will take you through the transformation from raw materials to splendid craft-wares. The numerous items made in the workshops are inspired by the rich Cambodia heritage. In the afternoon, visit the Angkor Silk Farm which consists of 8 hectare in rural Cambodia (16km west of Siem Reap Town). Visitors will discover and understand the whole silk production process, from mulberry tree growing to silk weaving. Enroute back to town, you will see the West Baray . It is a reservoir oriented east-west and located just west of the walled city Angkor Thom. Rectangular in shape and measuring approximately 8 by 2.1 km, the West Baray is the largest baray at Angkor. Its waters are contained by tall earthen dikes. In the center of the baray is the West Mebon, a Hindu temple built on an artificial island. At night, enjoy a buffet dinner while watching the traditional Apsara Dance performance.	Breakfast Lunch Dinner
